If you have heard people talking about medical transcription and you have been asking yourself "[What is a medical transcriptionist?](#)" then keep reading. A medical transcriptionist is a professional who receives recorded dictation from doctors and other medical professionals and transcribes the audio to a typed hardcopy of the medical file. They are then responsible for sending it back to the office it came from to be stored away. It is a greatly rewarding career that requires minimal training for the benefits you can reap.

Another question that many people ask next is “[What is a medical transcriptionist salary?](#)” The medical transcriptionist makes an average of 40K a year, but they may also make less or much more depending on the pace and accuracy of their work. The great thing about the MT’s salary is that it is typically based on experience, so the harder you work towards perfecting your skills, the more it will pay off in the end. There are some experienced MT’s out there making upwards of 70 or 80K a year! The opportunities are really endless in this career path, which is just another reason it is becoming so popular.

There are two different ways that MT’s are paid. Sometimes they are paid by the hour and sometimes they are paid by the completed line. The transcriptionists who are paid hourly usually work directly in the office of the company they are employed by. This way there is always someone there overseeing the progress of the work that the MT is producing. These transcriptionists make an average of \$14 an hour, but can make more or less depending on how long they have been an MT. Another, more popular option, is working from home. These MT’s are usually paid by the line, so that it doesn’t really matter how much time they take to finish the task, the more they produce, the more they get paid. The pay per line for medical transcriptionists who work from home is approximately \$0.06 to \$0.12 a line depending on accuracy and experience.

Medical Transcription is quickly becoming one of the most popular professions of our time as working from home becomes increasingly enticing to many Americans. Some of the main reasons this profession is so popular is that it offers a great deal of flexibility with location choices as well as many different salary options.
